## BAND WITH JAMES HARDING 4<sup>TH</sup>- 8<sup>TH</sup> Grade Thursday 7:30-8:30 a.m. Start Date TBD

The San Francisco School band rehearses once a week before school. It is required that students have completed one year of study on their instrument and currently be working outside of band with a teacher. In the band, students work on ensemble reading skills through a varied repertoire of music. Any instrument can be considered for band; over the years, band has included: flute, saxophones (alto and tenor), clarinet, trumpet, trombone, violin, electric bass, electric guitar, piano/keyboard, marimba/vibes, and drums/percussion. The band performs at the Middle School Spring concert in May, 8th grade graduation, and within school at other various celebrations.

#### AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL WITH SOLVEIG DIMON 6<sup>TH</sup> - 8<sup>TH</sup> Grade Friday 3:30-4:30 p.m.

Students in this class will discuss current issues in their communities and around the world. SFS has one of the few middle school chapters of Amnesty International (AI) in the Bay Area. The purpose of our chapter is to support the mission of AI. This is an excerpt of AI's mission: "We are people from across the world standing up for humanity and human rights. Our purpose is to protect people wherever justice, freedom, truth and dignity are denied. We investigate and expose abuses, educate and mobilize the public, and help transform societies to create a safer, more just world. We received the Nobel Peace Prize for our life-saving work." Middle school students who join Amnesty will choose a human rights campaign to work on this school year and work to educate our communities. This may take the form of phone-calling or letter writing campaigns, setting up a table on campus or on 24th Street, or hosting a speaker. This work is rewarding and educational!

## ACADEMIC CHESS 1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>TH</sup> Grade Monday 3:30-4:30 p.m. Semester Fee: \$180 for 9 sessions, Extended Day charges apply after 4:30 p.m.

This chess class is designed for everyone from the beginner to the advanced player. With their innovative teaching methods, Academic Chess attendees will learn the basic principles behind the opening game, middle game tactics/objectives, and endgame strategies.

Learning this ancient game, participants will develop patience, foster critical thinking skills, and understand that decisions result in consequences. All participants will receive exclusive Academic Chess workbooks.

### MULTICULTURAL ART WITH CHRISTINA 1<sup>st</sup> – 5<sup>TH</sup> Grade Wednesday 3:30-4:30 p.m. Semester Fee: \$200 for 10 sessions, Extended Day charges apply after 4:30 p.m.

Students in this course will have the opportunity to learn different styles of art including: Chinese warrior prints and cherry blossom paintings, African masks using plaster of Paris, Aboriginal dot paintings, Indonesian shadow puppets, Amate bark paintings from Mexico, Molas paper crafts from Central America, Native American spirit animal paintings, and more! Students will experience a variety of art mediums from different parts of the world and learn a little about each international destination. It will be a passport of art projects both exciting and fun for all students.

GIRLS CODE WITH BYTES FOR BITS 3<sup>RD</sup> – 8<sup>TH</sup> Grade Girls Only Thursday 3:30-4:30 p.m. Semester Fee: \$50\* for 3 sessions\*, Extended Day charges apply after 4:30 p.m. \**Reduced pricing made possible by a generous donation*

U.S. college graduates fill only 29% of jobs in computer related fields. Women fill just 3%. Let's change that! In this three-week course, girls will receive a head start in learning the fundamentals of software coding. Students work in Scratch, a visual coding tool, where they click virtual blocks together like Legos to make characters move and interact.

CODING WITH BYTES FOR BITS 3<sup>RD</sup> – 8<sup>TH</sup> Mixed-Gender Thursday 3:30-4:30 p.m. Semester Fee: \$200 for 5 sessions\*, Extended Day charges apply after 4:30 p.m. \**Reduced pricing made possible by a generous donation* 

Dates: 10/5, 10/12, 10/19, 10/26, 11/2 Minimum number of students: 10 Maximum number of students: 32 This weekly mixed-gender after school program will build on the girls-only course continuing to teach the fundamentals of software coding. This course is designed to inspire, educate, and equip students in grades 3 – 8 while working in the Scratch coding platform. <u>After registration, students will be separated into two groups based on their current skills and abilities.</u>

Lesson plans are modular so each student can progress at their own pace. Each class introduces some base concepts and then has a number of challenges that allow students to bring their creativity to the task. Classes for experienced kids are more project oriented and less about base concept learning, while continuing exposure to complex challenges. The objective is to create a fun and educational environment where students can get comfortable with the concepts of code and craft something that is their own.

# INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC LESSONS

FLUTE LESSONS WITH SUE FLEMING 4<sup>TH</sup> - 8<sup>TH</sup> Grade Monday 3:30-5:30 p.m.\*

Semester Private Lesson Fee: \$45 per half-hour lesson, Extended Day charges apply from dismissal until the time of lesson and after the lesson until pick-up \*Lesson times will vary, contact Sarah <u>swood@sfschool.org</u> to schedule

Private half-hour lessons (with occasional one-hour group lessons for duets or ensemble pieces) for beginning, intermediate, and advanced flute students. Students will experience repertoire ranging from world music to classical, while they learn to read music and rhythms, music theory, and proper flute-playing techniques. Students will also be able to polish pieces for band and class performances. Rental or purchase of a flute and purchase of flute books is necessary for this course.

Sue Fleming has been a private flute teacher for over 44 years, and has over 35 years of experience teaching instrumental music in schools in Ohio and throughout the San Francisco Bay Area. Sue and her husband Joe reside in San Francisco where they have raised 4 kids - 1 currently in college and 3 college graduates - who are all musicians, athletes, and scholars. In the in-between moments, Sue sings with the San Francisco Choral Society and has a love for good coffee, reading, and learning to play new instruments.

### VIOLIN AND VIOLA LESSONS WITH MICHAEL NICHOLAS K -8<sup>TH</sup> Grade Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday 3:30-5:30 p.m.\*

Private or small group lessons for beginning or intermediate students. Students will learn how to hold the instrument, how to tune, finger placement, bowing technique and basic music theory.

Michael's background and focus is classical violin and viola, but he enjoys and teaches many genres, including folk and traditional music from around the world. Originally from New York, he studied with a handful of the finest violinists of our time including Arnold Steinhardt and Eugene Drucker and has performed in the U.S. and Europe as a soloist, chamber musician, orchestra member, and in recordings of many stripes. He previously taught at Queens College and Weston Music Center in New York and Connecticut.

Eastman School of Music graduate Morgan Nilsen earned a Bachelor's of Music in clarinet performance and the Diploma in Ethnomusicology. Nilsen studied under the direction of the New York Metropolitan Opera Orchestra's former principal clarinetist Jon Manasse. A versatile and active performer in San Francisco, Nilsen performs in groups that focus on music from the Balkans and Turkey, Latin America, and the Middle East. In 2015 Nilsen toured internationally to Colombia, Turkey, Greece, and Bulgaria to study traditional music with masters. She has been teaching at The San Francisco School since 2010 and is looking forward to the upcoming school year! In class, students will learn clarinet technique, to read sheet music, improvise, Western classical music, and traditional songs from across the globe.

## DRUMMING WITH MICHAELLE GOERLITZ 2<sup>ND</sup> - 8<sup>TH</sup> Grade Tuesday 3:30-5:30\* p.m.

Semester Private Lesson Fee: \$45 per half-hour sessions, Extended Day charges apply from dismissal until the time of lesson and after the lesson until pick-up \* Lesson times will vary, contact Sarah <u>swood@sfschool.org</u> to schedule

Students will learn basic music fundamentals as applied to both stick and hand drumming. Students will also learn how drums and percussion can play in harmony with each other.

Michaelle has been teaching at The San Francisco School for 10 years, as well as a variety of camps in the Bay Area: Lafayette Summer Jazz Camp, Born to Drum (a women's drumming camp), and the Blues & Jazz Camp for Girls at the Jazz School in Berkeley. A resident of the Bay Area since 1980, she is a member of the VNote Ensemble, and has played and/or recorded with many artists, including Wayne Wallace, Jackeline Rago, Tammy Hall, Mark Levine, Grupo Samba Rio, rhiannon and Houston Pearson.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

My child is interested in a class that ends at 4:30 p.m., will I be charged if I do not pick up promptly at 4:30?

• Yes, students will be charged for any portion of time after their class ends at the \$10/hour rate.

What if the class doesn't reach the minimum numbers?

• Under enrolled courses will be cancelled and families who have registered informed via email prior to the start of the class.

What if the class surpasses the maximum number?

• Over enrolled classes will generate a waitlist for students in the case of a cancellation.

How do I register for classes?

My child wants to take an instrumental lesson, what is the process?

- Email Sarah Wood <u>swood@sfschool.org</u> to state preference for instrument and availability.
- Instrumental lesson schedules will be arranged and families informed of lesson days/times. Please know that every attempt is made to accommodate day-of-the-week preferences, but it may be difficult or impossible to always fulfill the first choice of each family.
- In the case of a missed lesson, please inform the instrumental music teacher, the front desk, and Sarah the morning before the lesson. If no notice is received, no refund will be given.

What are the procedures for signing my child in and out of Extended Day?

- Students in Elementary and Middle School are signed into the Extended Day program from dismissal to 3:30 p.m. using the Kinderlime iPad application.
- Students are signed out from the Extended Day program at the Front Desk upon arrival of their guardian for pickup. Authorized guardians will sign the child out using the Kinderlime iPad application. Students who are not signed out will automatically be signed out at 6:00 p.m.
- Preschool students are signed in and out across from the Preschool Extended Day Room using the Kinderlime iPad application and each families unique four digit code.

What if I am late for carpool?

- Students still in carpool at 3:25 p.m. will be signed into their choice of Extended Day drop-in options (Legarza All Sports, Learning Lab, etc.)
- Once the authorized guardian has arrived, the student will be signed out at the Front Desk and pay the rate of \$10/hour.
- If you have not already pre-purchased a punch card you will be asked to do so at sign out.
