HIGHLIGHTS





- » SFS community is strong, with families and staff that are kind, welcoming, and inclusive. They are partners, encouraging close collaboration between home and school.
- » SFS teachers truly know their students. With small classes, an integrated curriculum, and a collaborative culture, SFS teachers are able to provide an outstanding academic, creative, and social-emotional education.
- » The School has ten dedicated specialist teachers in Spanish, Music, Art, and Health & Wellness. These classes occur at least weekly in every division.
- The School offers Spanish beginning in Preschool and offers multiple proficiency levels beginning in Middle School.
- » The Adventure Playground is an expansive outdoor space featuring the Field Station, a 50 ft slide, a barn, a gazebo, native California plants and trees, and open green space for imaginative play and academic endeavors.
- » The Steve Morris Community Center features a full-size gym/ 350-seat theater.
- » More than 80% of middle school students participate in competitive interscholastic athletics including Cross Country, Volleyball, Basketball, and Futsal.
- » The School offers a robust student support team, including learning specialists, middle school advisors, full-time school nurse, a lower school educational therapist, and an upper school counselor.
- » SFS is committed to social justice and creating the global citizens that our world needs now more than ever.
- » In 2021, we closed Forge Our Future: The Campaign for SFS which raised nearly \$7M to enhance the School's STEAM program and to increase the endowment to safeguard our diverse and inclusive community and ensure our long-term stability.
- The SFS community is inclusive and welcomes family involvement through the Family Association, the Board of Trustees and its committees, educational opportunities, and school-wide events.


