
Dear Rising 4th Grade Families,

My name is Angelica Faustino, and as you may already know, for the past three years, I've had the privilege of working with the Preschool teams here at SFS. As I step into my 4th year at this school, I am excited to be your child's 4th Grade Humanities Teacher! Damon Allswang and I had the honor of officially meeting your children at our Move Up meeting. The students were enthusiastic, curious and a lot of fun to work with.

At our Move Up meeting, I explained their summer literacy work, which they should have brought home with them. Damon was not able to be there but should be distributing the summer math work next week. I recommend reminding your child to take the work out of their backpack and put it somewhere safe so it's easy to find when they start it over summer vacation.

### Reading

- Read *Riding Freedom* by Pam Munoz Ryan before the first day of school. (Your child was given a copy of this book at the move up meeting; this is theirs to keep! If you notice this book may be a stretch for your child's reading level, please read it with them.)
- Optional. I have scheduled a virtual Book Club via Google Meet once per month to help kids stay on track and give them a place to talk about the story. Google Meet link will be sent to parents/guardians. Here is the info about that:

#### Writing

## Why did Angelica assign us this for homework?


In 4th grade, you will be expected to do a lot more writing than in previous years, and she wants your writing muscles to be strong on the first day of school!

I will not be reading through their Journals to check for completion, so I have included a summer calendar for them to check off each day they complete an entry. Parents/guardians should sign each month to confirm that this work was actually done (please sign in the sun image). This is what I'll be looking for the first week back to school.
