

### Here is a video introduction to Summer Work!

Summer is a great time for unstructured play, time with family and friends, and frolicking in the great outdoors! And, a bit of summer homework can keep a student's skills fresh and ready for 2nd Grade. Please find a balance between these two needs that feels just right to your family. All completed activities will be turned in to Angelica (and Molly) in the fall, and celebrated with a little treat 2.

Your child should have everything they need to complete their Summer Work in their Summer Work folders.

On this page, you will find videos with directions for the assigned activities (to watch if your child needs a reminder about how to complete an activity), extra copies to print (in case yours run afoul of life), and supplemental materials (in case you want more)!

One last note– the Summer Homework is yours to differentiate! It should be at a "just right" level for many First Graders, but if your child needs more support or challenge, adjust as necessary, making assignments shorter, changing numbers to be bigger/smaller, or cutting activities out entirely.
